

SRRA Green Reiner Program

SRRA proudly offers a Green Reiner program to those beginning their journey as competitive reiners. Features of the program include:

- ✓ Open to Non-Pro riders only.
- ✓ Riders have earned less than \$100.00 in NRHA lifetime earnings prior to January 1st of the year they enter the program.
- ✓ Riders must ride in the Green Reiner class at every SRRA show they attend to accrue points.
- ✓ Riders must not have won a year-end championship buckle or other Green Reiner award.
- ✓ Points are added from all SRRA and NRHA classes in which the Green Reiner shows.
- ✓ No entry fee is charged. A judge's fee may be charged.
- ✓ No ownership restrictions apply.
- ✓ Riders may show one or two handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRHA.

An individual may petition the SRRA Board of Directors if they feel there are special circumstances that qualify them for the Green Reiner program.

Green Reining riders are awarded points based on the judge's score. SRRA accumulates and tracks scores above 60. Points carry over from year to year. The year a rider earns 80 points they are awarded their Green Reiner buckle at the year-end awards banquet. Money earned during the riders' participation in the Green Reiner program will not change a rider's eligibility status.

Example (GRP = Green Reiner Points):

Maneuver Scores:

- ◆ - 1 1/2: Extremely Poor
- ◆ - 1: Very Poor
- ◆ - 1/2: Poor
- ◆ 0: Correct
- ◆ + 1/2 Good
- ◆ + 1 Very Good
- ◆ + 1 1/2 Excellent

It is our privilege to offer you this reining event, and we appreciate your participation. Please know that you are amongst friends here! It is our goal to provide all competitors and prospective competitors with a positive, rewarding reining experience.

This brochure contains SRRR specific show rules and definitions that will be helpful to you as you participate in one of our shows. Substantive and detailed information about reining activities, patterns and rules can be found in the NRHA rule book.

If you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact a SRRR officer at any time!

What to know about competing in a SRRR Show:

- ✓ All riders and owners of horses showing in NRHA or SRRR approved competitions must be members in good standing of each association respectively.
- ✓ Competition licensing is not required for SRRR classes but is necessary if a class is NRHA approved. See NRHA handbook.
- ✓ All NRHA approved classes will conform to the NRHA rules and regulations.
- ✓ The SRRR follows the NRHA rules of conduct and behavior.

Classes unique to SRRR or changed in 2010:

SRRR Green Horse Open

Open to all riders. Horses must have earned \$1000.00 or less in lifetime NRHA earnings prior to January 1st of the current year. Rider may show one or two handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRHA handbook.

SRRR Green Horse Non-Pro

Open to Non-Pro riders including youth. Non-Pro ownership restrictions as defined by the NRHA apply. Horses must have earned \$1000.00 or less in lifetime NRHA earnings prior to January 1st of the current year. Rider may show one or two handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRHA handbook.

SRRR Green Reiner

A Non-Pro rider may elect to enter the Green Reiner Program. Please refer to the Green Reiner section on the back page for more information on this program.

SRRR Four (4) and Under

Limited to horses 4 years old and under. Open to all riders. To be shown in any legal bit or hackamore. Rider to show one or two handed. Please refer to the NRHA handbook for bit and/or hackamore requirements.

SRRR Rookie

Open to Non-Pro riders including youth. Rider may not have won more than \$500.00 in NRHA earnings as of January 1st of the current year. This must be a jackpot class. No ownership restrictions apply. Rider must show one handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRHA.

SRRR Green Rookie

Open to Non-Pro riders including youth. Rider may not have won more than \$200.00 in NRHA earnings as of January 1st or the current year. This must be a jackpot class. No ownership restrictions apply. Rider may show one or two handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRHA.

SRRR Chicks and Dudes

Open to all riders including youth. Rider must show one handed in any legal bit as defined by NRHA. All ownership restrictions apply as outlined in the NRHA handbook.

SRRR Youth

There are two SRRR Youth classes: ages 13 and under and 14-18. The classes are open to youth riders in their respective age divisions. The appropriate division for a youth is determined by their age on January 1st of the current year. Rider to show one or two handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRHA. No restrictions on ownership.

SRRR Short Stirrup (10 and Under)

Open to any youth 10 and under on January 1 of the current calendar year. No ownership restrictions apply. Rider to show one or two handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRHA and there will be no penalty for holding the saddle with either hand. The rider may ride with standard reins or any type of closed rein. The class is to be run with Pattern 11 only.
